<u>Crystal Springs Rhododendron Garden</u>	<p>More than 2,500 rhododendrons, azaleas, and companion plants make up the garden. Beginning in early spring and continuing into summer, they provide a magnificent display of color, giving visitors the opportunity to view many varieties rarely seen in the Pacific Northwest.</p>	<p>Admits a family of four. There is no admission fee on Mondays. Admission is free from Oct 1 - Feb. 28. Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar month.</p>	
<u>End of the Oregon Trail Interpretive Center</u>	<p>Relive Oregon's rich history and get a glimpse into the life and times of those who traveled the Oregon Trail. The Interpretive Center features displays and videos depicting the lives of Oregon's pioneers.</p>	<p>Admits 2 adults and 6 children. Last admission is 1 hour before closing. Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar month.</p>	
<u>Evergreen Aviation Museum</u>	<p>Our exhibits celebrate the lives of innovators, pilots, and veterans who courageously pioneered flight in these remarkable machines. Displays showcase aviation technology ranging from the Wright brothers to state of the art supersonic jets. The Centerpiece of these aeronautic breakthroughs is the original Spruce Goose, a massive airplane built of wood due to restrictions on metals during World War II.</p>	<p>Pass admits two (2) individuals into the Museum, regardless of age. Any individual under the age of 17 must be accompanied by an adult and children under 5 will get in for free. Pass does not include entrance to the water park, tours of the Spruce Goose, Flight Simulator Rides, or members only tours. Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar month.</p>	

<p>Genealogical Forum of Oregon</p>	<p>Discover your heritage at the largest genealogy research library in the Pacific Northwest. The Genealogical Forum of Oregon offers access to 52,000 holdings, 8 subscription computer databases, and 180 educational classes every year. Resources cover every state and many countries. We are located in the basement of the Historic Ford Building. This Pass is also good for \$4 off GFO membership on the day the pass is used.</p>	<p>Admits one person. There is no admission fee on the first Monday of the month.</p> <p>Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar year.</p>	
<p>Gilbert House Children's Museum</p>	<p>Our fifteen diverse exhibits and 20,000 ft square Outdoor Discovery Area provide hands-on learning while inspiring creative play in areas of science, technology, engineering, art, and math.</p>	<p>Admits five people. Any child under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult. All adult visitors must be accompanied by a child or museum staff. Parents under the age of 18 are always welcome with their own children.</p> <p>Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar month</p>	
<p>Lan Su Chinese Garden</p>	<p>Portland's Lan Su Chinese Garden is a stunning blend of architecture, poetry, stone and botanical art in the heart of the city, the Old Town Chinatown neighborhood. Built by 65 Chinese artisans using traditional techniques, it has been called the most authentic, Suzhou-style garden outside of China.</p>	<p>This pass admits one person, age 16 or older. NOTE: Pass is valid during normal open hours only. Pass does not include special events after normal open hours, such as Jazz in the Garden, special after hours events are available for purchase, see venue web site for more information. Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar year.</p>	

<p>Oregon Garden</p>	<p>The Oregon Garden showcases plant life from Oregon and around the Pacific Northwest. Featuring more than 20 specialty gardens such as the Amazing Water Garden, Children's Garden, and Sensory Garden, this 80 acre destination caters to visitors of all ages.</p>	<p>Admits 2 Adults and 4 Children (up to age 18). Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar month.</p>	
<p>Oregon Historical Society</p>	<p>Featuring exhibits showcasing Oregon's history, the Oregon Historical Society Museum presents a fascinating perspective of the state's past. The museum seeks to make Oregon's history accessible to all. Come see collections highlighting more than 200 years of Oregon history.</p>	<p>Admits 2. Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar month.</p>	
<p>Oregon State Parks</p>	<p>Park at over 20 Oregon State Parks using the Oregon State Parking Pass. See the full list of participating locations, including destinations in the Columbia Gorge, Oregon Coast, and other areas of the state.</p>	<p>Allows one vehicle to park in any participating Oregon State Park location. Library card holders may reserve 2 per calendar month.</p>	
<p>Pittock Mansion</p>	<p>Built in 1914, the Pittock Mansion provides a glimpse into Portland's growth and transformation around the turn of the century.</p>	<p>Admits 2 Adults and 2 Children. Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar year.</p>	

<p>Portland Art Museum</p>	<p>Founded in 1892, the Portland Art Museum is the seventh oldest museum in the U.S. and the oldest in the Northwest. The Museum is internationally recognized for exhibitions drawn from the world's finest collections. Permanent collections include American, Asian, European, modern and contemporary, Native American, Northwest art, photography, and graphic arts. The Museum is located in the heart of downtown's cultural district.</p>	<p>Admits 2 adults (18 and older) for \$5 each. Special exhibition fees may apply. Children 17 and under are free. The Museum offers free Museum admission on the first Thursday of every month from 5–8 p.m.</p> <p>Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar month.</p>	
<p>Portland Japanese Garden</p>	<p>Proclaimed to be the most beautiful and authentic Japanese garden in the world outside of Japan, Portland Japanese Garden sits nestled in the hills of Washington Park. Designed in 1963, it encompasses 12 acres with eight separate garden styles, and includes an authentic Japanese Tea House, meandering streams, intimate walkways, and a spectacular view of Mt. Hood. This is a place to discard worldly thoughts and concerns and see oneself as a small but integral part of the universe.</p>	<p>Admits 2 adults and up to 8 children age 17 and younger. Tip for visitors: fewer people visit the garden in the afternoon hours. Please consider using your pass later in the day to avoid crowds.</p> <p>Library card holders may reserve 1 per calendar year.</p>
